



RADIOGRAPHY TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Applications must be completed in full; incomplete applications will not be considered.
2. Applying does not guarantee admission to the program.
3. A competitive, point-based process determines admittance into the Radiography Technology Program. Registration is not first-come, first-serve.
4. Up to 16 students will be admitted to the program.
5. Applicants will need to register to become an MTECH student and pay a \$30 Application Fee at the time they submit their applications.
6. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and have a high school diploma or GED.
7. Applicants must have an Associate's Degree and have passed Human Anatomy w/Lab (4 credits) and Physiology w/Lab (4 credits) with a B- or higher.

OR

Applicants must have completed the prerequisites and graduation requirements for the AAS Healthcare Services degree (See below) including Human Anatomy w/Lab (4 credits) and Physiology w/Lab (4 credits) with a B- or higher.

8. A background check and a drug screen must be completed once accepted into the Radiography Technology program. Results must be received by MTECH 3 weeks before the start of the program. Results may determine your acceptance into the program.
9. If you are applying for Federal Financial Aid, please go to <https://mtec.edu/financial-aid> for more information. It is recommended that you apply at least six weeks prior to the first day of class to ensure processing before you start the program.
10. This is a 1600 clock hour program, which includes 935 hours of clinicals.
11. Attendance is mandatory and students are expected to pass all tests with an 80% or higher.

MTECH MISSION STATEMENT

To enhance the employability of individuals through market-driven career and technical education.

PROGRAM MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Radiography Technology Program is to prepare students with both the academic education and the technical knowledge, skills, and abilities to gain employment after graduation. MTECH students will know how to produce high quality imaging, understand radiation safety practices, deliver exceptional patient care to the patient and understand their role as a health care team member by providing the rest of the healthcare team with the necessary information they need.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The primary mission of the Radiography Technology program is to prepare students for a career as a Registered Radiologic Technologist. The primary responsibility of a radiologic technologist is to create images of patients' bodies using medical imaging equipment. Imaging exams help medical providers diagnose and treat injuries and diseases. Students in this program will be instructed in classroom and laboratory settings to learn on-the-job skills and then apply their knowledge in a clinical setting. Students will have the opportunity to gain experience in many healthcare settings including but not limited to hospitals, urgent care facilities, and family practice clinics.

PREREQUISITES

1. Students must satisfy the entrance requirements with the MTECH testing center
2. Students must have a high school diploma or GED
3. Students must complete ONE of the following options regarding prerequisites:
 - o Option 1)
 - i. Complete your Associate's degree (or higher) at any college or university of your choice **Private college degree(s) will need to be verified. Prospective students can look at this list to make sure their college degree accreditation meets the ARRT national registry requirements:

 - ii. Take Human Anatomy with Lab (4 credits) and Human Physiology with Lab (4 credits) and earn a B- or higher in each class. These classes must be taken within 5 years of applying to the program.

OR

- o Option 2)
 - i. Apply/Transfer/Attend Utah Valley University
 - ii. Complete the AAS Healthcare Services degree prerequisites. You will need to take 34 college credits from the AAS Healthcare Services degree list.
 - iii. Take Human Anatomy with Lab (4 credits) and Human Physiology with Lab (4 credits) and earn a B- or higher in each class
 - iv. After completing an MTECH program, you will be awarded 30 credits that will go toward your UVU Associate's degree. You can reach out to Emily Hill for any



questions you may have about this degree. She is the counselor for the Pre-Radiography Technology Program for MTECH/UVU. You can find her webpage and contact info here:

- v. If you are transferring to UVU, you may be subject to completing 20 "residential" credits. This means 20 of your credits must be taken from UVU.

AAS in HEALTHCARE SERVICES (This is for students WITHOUT an Associate’s degree or higher)

- All classes must be completed with a C or better except for Human Anatomy and Human Physiology that requires a B- or higher.
- We recommend the prerequisite classes to be taken from a regionally accredited college or university. i.e. Utah Valley University, Brigham Young University, Utah State University, Salt Lake Community College, Weber State University, etc. Courses must transfer equally to Utah Valley University. - After completion of the Radiography Technology Program at MTECH, students will be awarded 30 credits towards the AAS Healthcare Services degree at UVU.
- Students that completed the prerequisites and the Radiography Technology program will be awarded an AAS Healthcare Services Degree from Utah Valley University.
- Students that already have their associate’s degree or higher will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from MTECH in Radiography Technology.
- Students must have an Associate’s Degree or higher in order to sit for the ARRT National Registry Exam.

* - Courses will be counted toward credit total but are not a prerequisite or requirement for entry into the program. Students that take ZOOL 2320 will satisfy the ZOOL 1090 requirement.

** - Courses are HIGHLY SUGGESTED because they are prerequisites for other required courses. ENG 1010 is a prerequisite for many courses you will need. BIOL 1610 and BIOL 1615 will be counted as 3 General Biology credits and 2 elective credits. Courses are prerequisites for Human Anatomy w/Lab and Physiology w/Lab.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Students applying to be a Radiographic Technologist must be in good physical and mental health to withstand the rigors of the job.

Requirements may include:

- Manual dexterity. Pushing/Pulling of beds, wheelchairs, etc
- Good vision and hearing
- Great communication (hearing, listening, writing, and speaking)
- Must be able to lift 50 lbs. (some patients may be required to be pulled up, repositioned, or transferred from bed/wheelchair to the imaging tables)
- Chest compressions if needed for CPR



DRUG SCREEN

- Drug screens will be performed on students that are accepted into the program
- Failure to perform drug screen will forfeit your spot in the Radiography Technology program
- Further test(s) may be required by the medical review officer physician to determine safe level(s) of a controlled substance, if detected.
- If at any time during the program it is suspected that a student is under the influence of a controlled substance or abuse of alcohol, law enforcement may be called and the student may be required to take a drug test. If a student declines the request, or tests positive for misuse of any substance, they may be dismissed from the program.
- MTECH is not responsible for the cost of any drug screens and students should be prepared to pay for them

BACKGROUND CHECK

- Students that are accepted into the program will need to complete a background check through the Radiography Technology program's system.
- Failure to complete background check will forfeit your spot in the Radiography Technology program
- MTECH is not responsible for the cost of the background check and students should be prepared to pay for them

EXTERNSHIP POLICY

Students will start their clinical internship during the second week of the Radiography Technology program. Students must pay all of their college costs and fees before they can start at their clinical site.

The Radiography Technology Program Coordinator arranges internship placements for all students to an appropriate facility. Students are responsible for transportation to and from their clinical sites. Students can rank their preferences of clinical sites but this does not guarantee they will be placed there. Students may have to travel up to 100 miles away from the student's home to their clinical internship facility.

The Radiography Technology clinical experience is a period of learning, observing, and practicing the skills learned in the student's program. Upon completion of each term, the clinical internship supervisor will complete an evaluation report of the student's performance. Failure to perform professionally while on a clinical rotation, including speech or demeanor, which reflects poorly on the college or affiliated clinical externship site, may result in dismissal from the clinical site and/or college. Students are expected to complete their full clinical experience within the period of the program. Students are discouraged from scheduling breaks, vacations, or major life events during their program course and clinical externship.

Each Radiography Technology student is required to fulfill the American Registry of Radiographic Technologist (ARRT) clinical internship requirements. The requirements include clinical experience with 51 required competency procedures passed off and 935 hours clocked. Students must pass off each x-ray competency in the Lab **before** they can pass it off at their clinical site. X-ray competencies must be passed off with an RT or the clinical supervisor at their clinical site.



ARRT NATIONAL REGISTRY EXAM (Registered Radiologic Technologist)

Students in the Radiography Technology program must have an Associate's Degree or higher to be eligible to take the national registry exam. The American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) administers the registry examination. All Radiography Technology students must sit for this examination. Exams must be taken at one of the required Pearson Vue testing sites. The testing site will forfeit the exam attempt and fee if the student is late or absent for the date and time of the exam.

All questions about the national registry, testing sites, fees, etc will be addressed throughout the program and in the student's last term of the program. BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (BLS for the Healthcare Provider)

All participating Radiography facilities and hospitals require that each student be BLS Healthcare Provider certified. It is mandatory that ALL students attend the on-campus BLS Healthcare Provider course as part of the Radiography Technology Program.

PROGRESS AND ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

Students must stay current with program requirements and maintain an 80% (B grade) or better. If a student falls behind, they will be placed on an Academic Improvement Plan with their instructor. Failure to meet those requirements may result in being put on an academic probation with the counselor. If the terms of the probation are not met, the student may be dismissed from the program.

Due to the hands-on nature of the program, attendance is very important. It is very difficult to make up for missed training and as a result, a minimum of 95% attendance is required.

DRESS CODE POLICY

CLASSROOM DRESS CODE

Students are required to wear clothes and shoes approved by the MTECH dress code. Program specific scrubs may be required.

CLINICAL SITE DRESS CODE

Radiography Technology students are required to wear program specific scrubs at their clinical site. The scrub uniform for all clinical sites is a black scrub top and black scrub pants. Students are required to purchase their own scrubs through the Radiography Technology All Heart online scrub store. More information will be given to those students who have been accepted into the program. Closed toe shoes, in good repair, are to be worn at all times during your clinical shift. Open-toe shoes, canvas shoes, flip-flops, slippers, and sandals are not allowed for the safety of the student. Students will wear their uniform scrubs upon entrance to and upon exit from all clinical internship facilities. Students dressed inappropriately for their clinical internship site will be directed to leave the site. If a student fails to comply with the dress standards after counseling by the Program Coordinator or instructor, the student will meet with the Academic and Career Counselor. The student will improve or the student's dismissal will be required.



Hanging jewelry (long necklaces, hoop earrings, etc) is prohibited at all clinical sites, according to the policy of the assigned facility. Visible piercings are determined by your clinical site. During a rotation in MRI, please remember to remove all metal you're wearing before entering the room. I.e. jewelry, watches, badges, etc. Fingernails are required to be short and free of polish. Artificial, acrylic, gel, or dipped nails are prohibited, as they harbor copious amounts of microbes. Failure to adhere to this college and industry standards may result in a student's dismissal from the program. Good hygiene and grooming are essential. The college and all Radiography site facilities are smoking and vaping free campuses.

MTECH RADIOGRAPHY TECHNOLOGY CLASS & CLINICAL SCHEDULE

Students should expect to be in class from 8:00am - 2:30pm on classroom days twice a week. Students will be at clinicals twice a week on non-classroom days. Students will attend clinicals on a schedule provided by the clinical site. A 30-minute lunch break will be provided every day, regardless of location.

PROGRAM COST

The advertised cost of the program and required materials are subject to change at any time and without advanced notice. Please refer to the website for the most current information.

Please Note:

1. The non-refundable \$30 RT Program Application Fee must be paid before or when you turn in the MTECH Application Packet.
2. The \$40 MTECH Student Registration Fee will be paid once admitted to the Radiography Technology program.
3. Students are required to pay the fees for the drug screen, background check, and immunization record. Results must be in 3 weeks before the start of the program. Failure to complete these steps will forfeit your spot in the program and an alternate will be chosen.
4. Textbooks are bought each semester depending on the class you are taking. Required Textbooks can be found on the program syllabus of each class.
5. Once you are admitted to the Radiography Technology Program, you will need to register and pay for the program IN FULL at least two weeks before the program start date to Student Services. Tuition rates generally change annually on July 1st, and may increase from current rates.

Radiography Technology Application Acceptance Process

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU APPLY

- Once the application period is closed, the Radiography Technology Program Coordinator and Faculty will review all submissions. Up to 25 applicants will be invited for an interview with the Radiography Technology department.
- Incomplete application packets, and application packets not submitted by the deadline, will not be processed.
- Application evaluations use a point system with a standard rubric to select candidates based on the written essay, interview with the program faculty, and complete application packet requirements.



- Applicants with the highest overall scores following the interviews will be offered seats in the program.
- The Radiography Technology Program Coordinator and faculty reserve the right to interview additional qualified applicants if the initial interviewees do not meet minimum standards.

Applications are only good for one application period. If you apply, but are not accepted, you may reapply at another time. Admission to the Radiography Technology program and interviews are not guaranteed. Previous application packets are not retained. However, we do consider previous applications.

Radiography Technology Program acceptance notices will be sent within two weeks after interviews are completed.

NOTE: Admission to the program is contingent on the following items:

- Full payment of tuition, fees, and registration with Student Services, two weeks prior to class start date.
- Course grades and degrees that are being completed during the application period must meet the program requirements and proof be shown prior to enrolling in the Rad Tech program
- Background check must be complete and clear according to the facility standards
- Drug screens must be completed and clear according to the facility standards
- Immunization records must be completed and approved according to the facility standards



Application Packet Requirements

Application submission does not guarantee acceptance nor a program interview. Incomplete or applications will not be processed. Up to 20 applicants, selected by the Radiography Technology Program department, will be invited to a program interview. The Radiography Technology webpage has the current dates and deadlines for the application.

CHECKLIST: All documents below are required for consideration for acceptance into the RT Program. Sending documents to the program coordinator one by one will result in an incomplete application.

- Prerequisites:** (See above)
- Application for Admission forms:** completed and signed
- Apply to MTECH**
- Pay \$30 non-refundable fee to your MTECH student account:** include your receipt with your application
- Person History Essay/Statement:** Write a 1-page compelling essay on why you believe you will make a great Radiographic Technologist and how your experiences/talents/passion can contribute to the diversity of your cohort. **Format:** Include a title page with your title or topic name, your name, and date. Do not include your name on the actual essay. Use Times New Roman, Size 12-point font, double-spaced.
- Current CV or Resume:** include all medical work experience
- Job Shadow document:** This is not a requirement however, having shadowing hours can help your chances of getting into the program. (see page 8 above) Keep a record of the total hours shadowed, location of facility, name and signature of employee you worked with. Hours must be specific to a Radiology Department.
- Proof of Associate's Degree (or higher) or required courses from UVU:** Please include a copy of your diploma from your degree OR proof on a college transcript that you earned your degree. If you haven't earned your degree from UVU, please show proof that you earned the credits from UVU that will award your AAS Healthcare Services degree at the end of the program.
- Official College Transcripts:** Please include all relevant official college transcript(s) with your complete application. Transcript(s) must be sealed, signed and included in your application. Screen shots of your transcripts will not be accepted.
- Background checks:** will be completed on students that are accepted into the program.
 - Failure to complete the background check will result in forfeiting your spot to the program
 - Students are required to pay the fee for the background check.
 - More information will be given to the students that are accepted into the program
- Drug Screen:**
 - Drug Screens will be completed on students that are accepted into the program
 - Failure to complete the drug screen will result in forfeiting your spot to the program
 - Students are required to pay the fee for the drug screen.
 - More information will be given to the students that are accepted into the program
- A copy of immunization documentation.** All of the following immunization records are required for entrance into the program. Immunization records will be verified and completed by the students that are accepted into the program. More information will be given to the students that are accepted into the program. Failure to provide a complete record will result in a forfeit



of your spot in the program. Please make sure all of the following immunizations are up to date prior to applying to the program.

1. Tuberculosis screening requirements. **One** of the following is required:
 - a. 2-step TST (two separate Tuberculin Skin Tests, aka PPD tests) is placed no sooner than seven (7) days apart and no longer than twelve (12) months a part. The last TST should be completed at the time the student begins their clinical site.
 - b. One (1) QuantiFERON Gold blood test with negative result.
 - c. One (1) T-SPOT blood test with negative result.

***If previously positive to any TB test, student must complete a symptom questionnaire and have a chest x-ray read by a radiologist with abnormal result. Chest x-ray must have been taken within the previous 6 months. If chest x-ray is abnormal, the student needs to be cleared by their physician or local health department before beginning their training at an Intermountain Healthcare Facility.
2. Measles (Rubeola), Mumps and Rubella requirement. **One** of the following is required:
 - a. Proof of two (2) MMR vaccinations.
 - b. Proof of immunity to Measles (Rubeola), Mumps, Rubella through a blood test prior to immunization.
3. Tdap requirement:
 - a. Proof of one (1) Tdap vaccination after age ten.
4. Varicella (Chicken Pox) requirement. **One** of the following is required:
 - a. Proof of two (2) Varicella vaccinations.
 - b. Proof of immunity to Varicella through a blood test prior to immunization.
5. Flu Vaccination requirement:
 - a. Proof of current, annual influenza vaccination.
6. COVID-19 Vaccination requirement (*If placed at an IHC location). One of the following is required:
 - a. If vaccine requires: proof of two (2) COVID-19 vaccinations.
 - b. If vaccine requires: proof of one (1) COVID-19 vaccination.
7. Hepatitis B series. **One** of the following is required:
 - a. Documentation of three (3) Recombivax HB or Engerix-B Hepatitis B vaccinations (dose 2 given at least one month after dose 1, and dose 3 given at least five months after dose 2) and HBsAb blood test with "Positive" or "Reactive" result.
 - b. Documentation of three (3) Recombivax HB or Engerix-B Hepatitis B vaccinations (dose 2 given at least one month after dose 1, and dose 3 given at least five months after dose 2) given more than 8 weeks prior to start date with no documented blood test results (no blood test is required, but a baseline titer should be run immediately if the person has a significant exposure to blood or body fluids).
 - c. HBsAb blood test with "Positive" or "Reactive" result.
 - d. Documentation of six (6) Hepatitis B Vaccinations with HBsAb blood test result of "Negative" or "Not Reactive" (this person is considered a "Non-Responder").
 - e. Documentation of two (2) Heplisav B vaccinations given at least 4 weeks apart and HBsAb blood test with "Positive" or "Reactive" result. Documentation of two (2) Heplisav B vaccinations given at least 4 weeks apart with no documented blood test results (no blood test is required, but a baseline titer should be run immediately if the person has a significant exposure to blood or body fluids).

*Pregnant students need to consult their physician before beginning the vaccinations and tests.

**Please note: It is the right of MTECH's participating clinical facilities to deny the student entry into their facility if the student is not completely vaccinated.
